Congratulations to Alexa Duff who set an Otago W17yr 500g Discus Record with a new distance of 46.91m (pending confirmation)! The previous record of 44.58m was also set by Alexa last year.

Congratulations to Rupert Lambert who set an Otago M50yr 60m Record with a new time of 7.73s (pending confirmation)! The previous record of 7.84 was set in 2020 by fellow HCU athlete, Tony Tan.

Congratulations to Fiona Centers who set an Otago MW35yr 100m Record with a new time of 12.71s (pending confirmation)! The previous record of 13.60 was set in 2020 by B Mitchell in 1990.

Finally, congratulations to Keith Hutton (Otago masters) who set an Otago M75yr Record in the High Jump with a new distance of 1.03m (pending confirmation)! The NZMA standard was 1.00m. Keith also set an Otago M75yr Record in the Javelin with a new distance of 24.34m (pending confirmation). The NZMA standard was 22.00m.

ODT- Paralympics, Paris, progress - Grimaldi reflects on the journey.

Anna Grimaldi celebrated a career milestone by winning gold in the 200m at the Paris Paralympics, setting an Oceania record. This victory was especially meaningful after a serious injury had sidelined her from the event for years.

Despite a disappointing fourth-place finish in the long jump, Anna focused on her growth and confidence, emphasizing that her worth wasn't defined by medals.

Her success in Paris reignited her passion for the sport, shifting her mindset from considering retirement after Tokyo to feeling excited for the future, with plans to continue training for the next Paralympic cycle toward LA.

Radio NZ- Paralympic champion Anna Grimaldi: 'It is a new era of my career'.

Anna Grimaldi reflects on recently shifting her focus to sprinting- in part, due to the physical toll long jump has taken on her body. Anna emphasises a need for balance and freedom in her approach to high-performance sport:



"Grimaldi won her first Paralympics long jump gold medal in a shock victory at the Rio 2016 Games, then she backed it up with gold again in the long jump at the Tokyo Games in 2021. But this year in Paris it was her sprinting that saw her get onto the Paralympic podium..."

"For it to go so well was a shock but also I think me and my coach knew there was a bit of an opportunity to be able to do something special, we just didn't know how special." ...

"I feel like it is a new era of my career where I really love running, I'm good at running and I want to do more of it and I think that's a really exciting place to be in..."

NZSSAA Teams Announcement- 2024 NZSS Track & Field and Road Championships Team.

Once again NZSSAA will select a Championship team for athletes performing with excellence at their annual Championships in Timaru. This is a large team selected across all events including the road race. The selection is announced at the end of the Championships. Each athlete earning selection earns a \$250 travel award to be used in pursuit of their athletics competitions and a product item from SAS sports.

NZSSAA will select a NZSS Track & Field team for 2025 Central Classics Meets and will be eligible to compete at other Athletics NZ Summer Permit Meets. Selection criteria and Expressions of Interest will be announced before the NZSS Championships.

NZSSAA will select a Track and Field team of 16-18 athletes to tour to the USA, West Coast in April 2025. Exact dates to be confirmed, approximately 9-22 April. Selection criteria will be compulsory attendance and achievements at NZSS Championships at Timaru 6-8 December 2024.
